



THE PRECINCT

Graysharps Road and the surrounding area of open space and community facilities contribute significantly towards the character and identity of Hurstbridge.

Forming part of an open space corridor, the Precinct is home to a range of community assets such as the cricket, football, netball and bowling clubs, basketball stadium, Hurstbridge Community Hub, preschools and the Hurst Family Graveyard. It also features the Diamond Creek, which is home to a diverse range of flora and fauna, and the creek and surrounds is subject to periodic flooding.

BACKGROUND

Planning commenced in early 2016 with an in-depth analysis of the existing conditions which identified a range of opportunities and constraints. This content was developed into a draft framework which was presented at a series of community stakeholder workshops and walking tours in mid 2016 which provided Council with valuable feedback.

The Project originally excluded a central area known as Lot 1, then envisioned as a location for medium density housing. In November 2016, Council determined that Lot 1 would be retained as open space and now forms part of this project.

The rezoning of Lot 1 to a Public Park and Recreation Zone has been deferred until the Precinct Plan has been prepared. This will enable the community's priorities for the site to be reflected in the appropriate zoning.

DISCUSSION PAPER

A Discussion Paper has been prepared to establish where we are now, including the feedback received from the community during the initial consultation in 2016.
